September 2010 Due Dates

● **Davidson College-Bryan Scholarship**

Designated for scholar athletes, is renewable for four years and is valued at \$30,000 annually. Nominations are due by September 9, 2010. Application can be downloaded at www.davidson.edu/admission/admis_bryan/BryanDesc.htm.

October 2010 Due Dates

● **Wendy's High School Heisman**

The 2010 Wendy's High School Heisman application is now available. Any eligible student can register and begin the application process now. This year, they want to hear from student athletes that work hard, are dedicated, and have become role models for their school's underclassmen! Eligibility for the application is limited exclusively to students who will be in their senior year of high school during the 2010-2011 academic year. Athletes must have at least a "B" grade average and participate in at least one of the 28 school-sponsored sports listed in the Wendy's High School Heisman application. The application submission deadline for students is October 3, 2010 at 5:00 pm (central time). Each applicant must have their completed application reviewed and confirmed online by a school representative. ● **AES Engineering Scholarship**

For that reason we are offering a scholarship that will be awarded on the basis of character, as determined by evaluating the essays that are submitted. Amount of award: \$500.00. Deadline for entry is October 8, 2010.

November 2010 Due Dates

● **South Carolina Teaching Fellows**

The S.C. Teaching Fellows Program is located only on select campuses. To receive a Teaching Fellows award, students must attend one of these campuses: Anderson University, Charleston Southern, College of Charleston, Columbia College, Furman University, Lander University, Newberry College, SC State University, USC-Columbia, USC-Upstate or Winthrop University. Award recipients agree to teach in South Carolina one year for every year they receive the fellowship. The award is worth up to \$6,000 per year. Applications are online only. • Spartanburg Methodist College

For the 11th year in a row, Spartanburg Methodist College is proud to offer our full tuition financial aid offer (no loans included) to 2011 graduates and LIFE Scholarship (3.00 GPA or better in a college prep curriculum) eligible students. We are interested in those students who will graduate with at least a 3.0 GPA on the Uniform Grading Scale (Life Scholarship eligible at SMC). We will offer these students a financial aid package equivalent to the cost of tuition (no loans included)! This way, their only cost concern will be the costs associated with being a boarding student if that is their desire. In all probability these students will even qualify for additional scholarship aid to help with this cost as well. • Navy ROTC Scholarships

• Call Me Mister

The "Call Me mister" Program is a collaboration between Clemson University and three private, historically black colleges in South Carolina (Benedict College, Claflin University, Morris College) to recruit, train, certify and secure employment for minority males as elementary teachers in the public schools of South Carolina. • American Legion Scholarship

Can attend college free in S.C. if parent was a war time veteran and met certain criteria: 1) was KIA 2) died while in service 3) died of disability resulting from service 4) was POW 5) is permanently and totally disabled, as determined by the VA from any cause 6) was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor 7) is MIA or 8) applicant is the child of deceased veteran who qualified under items 4) and 5). Must go to state supported or Tech School. Eligibility terminates at age 26. Free tuition as long as work and conduct are

- **LTAP (Lottery Tuition Assistance Plan)**

Some tuition at all two year colleges in South Carolina is covered by the regardless of income or GPA. The LTAP does require completion of the FAFSA as soon as you complete your tax returns each year. Many scholarships and institutional money require completion of the FAFSA yearly. See www.fafsa.ed.gov funding your education. A new FAFSA form is developed each year and will be available January 1, 2011 on their website. Use your 2009 income tax returns to complete this form on-line. The LIFE Scholarship at a two year college requires a 3.00 GPA (final senior GPA as of June, 2011) and covers a substantial amount of tuition and book fees. The LIFE Scholarship at a two year school does not require completion of the FAFSA but we strongly encourage you to complete the FAFSA.
